

Gaeil Trasteorann



De bharr chomhoibriú idir ‘**Glór na Móna**’, **Béal Feirste** agus ‘**Gaeilge Locha Riach i gContae na Gaillimhe**, d’éirigh leo duais trasteorann Ghlór na nGael a bhuachaint don dara bhliain as a chéile.

As a result of the great co-operation between ‘**Glór na Móna**’ of **Belfast** and **Gaeilge Locha Riach** of **Galway**, these groups won cross border national prize for the second year in a row.

Building on their links they have strengthened their relationship with a number of events over the summer. Musician and teachers from Belfast visited East Galway for the **Scoil Ceoil an tSamhraidh** and **Féile Touhey** pipers’ festival. Another family from Belfast have now been invited to stay in the area for a fortnight during the Irish language Summer Camp in August.

At the end of the week-long events of traditional music, Cormac Ó Briain, Irish Language development officer of Glór na Móna, Belfast said that they had all enjoyed their stay and looked forward to being able to take part next year.

Glór na Móna invited a family from East Galway to Belfast for the McCracken Summer school. There was so much demand on this offer that 'Gaeilge Locha Riach' raffled the holiday as a prize. The use of a 3 bedroomed house was family accommodation as well as an open invite to take part in the wide programme of events organized as part of the McCracken Summer School. Events included: Intensive Irish language classes for adults, Irish Summer Camp for children, films, drama, exhibitions as well as music, art and storytelling workshops. There was also a number of music sessions, concerts, ceilí's, walks and talks organized over the week.

Speaking on the holiday, Margaret Hannon said it was the first time that they had ever been to Belfast and that they really enjoyed the experience.
